Brief Description: We are offering two (2) \$1,500 scholarships to graduating seniors from high schools in West Hawaii who have been accepted at an accredited institution of higher learning, i.e., community college, college or university.

Purpose: The purpose of the scholarship is to support college bound students who wish to perpetuate and promote the Japanese culture.

Entry Format: Each applicant must complete and submit the Scholarship Application and an Essay about yourself, how the Japanese culture influenced your life here in Kona and your future plans.

The essay should be submitted on an 8 ½" X 11" white paper and printed on one side. The essay must contain no more than 600 words. Please provide the original and five (5) additional copies of your essay. DO NOT PUT YOUR NAME ON THE ESSAY. Each applicant must also submit a picture.

Submittal Deadline: The scholarship application and essay must be postmarked by **MARCH 19, 2021**. Please mail applications to:
